Report of Activities The Committee for the Protection of Jewish Heritage in Tarnów For the year 2016

The Committee for the Protection of Monuments of Jewish Culture In Tarnów was founded in 1989, with its headquarters at Regional Museum in Tarnów, Rynek 20-21. The goal of the Committee is the protection of the monuments of Jewish culture located in the former Galicia region. Moreover, the Committee engages in popularizing the knowledge about the culture of Polish Jews, strives for friendly relations between Poles/Christians and Jews, supports and organizes research and academic undertakings related to Jewish culture and monuments in the former Galicia region. The work of the members of the Committee is community service and they do not receive any remuneration for their efforts.

Similar to previous years, the most important event undertaken by the Committee (since 1996) is the annual Remembrance Days of Galician Jews, "Galicjaner Sztetl".

In 2016, "Galicjaner Sztetl" took place from June 9th through the 19th. The Project was funded by the budget of the city of Tarnów (14,000 zł), by the Malospolska Vojvodship (5,000 zł), and by the Regional Museum of Tarnow (4,000 zł). This project included the following events:

Thursday, June 9:

- 12:00 Prayer meeting in the Buczyna Forest of Zbylitowska Gora, the place of execution of Tarnów Jews.
- 18:30 Opening vernissage of the exhibition of the drawings of Yaacov Yaacobov from Israel (Tarnów Art Gallery).
- 20:30 Unveiling of the memorial plaque of the Kwadratstein Family Rynek 3.
- 21:00 Pushkin Klezmer Band from Kiev concert in the Rynek, Tarnów.

I. Education Project MEZUZA:

Continuation of the project started in March 2015; in 2016 we completed the next steps:

- "Let's talk about tolerance" 8 talks on the subject of the history and culture of Jews from Tarnow as well as tolerance (for pupils from the ages of 13 to 19 years as well as other students).
- "It was a city" 17 activities for children from the ages of 6 to 13 years regarding the history and culture of Jews from Tarnów. Historical walks in the form of urban games 20 walks on Jewish Tarnow routes (for pupils from the ages of 13 to 19 years as well as other students from the Tarnow University).
- "Forgotten archive" a mobile exhibition presenting archives regarding the history of Tarnów's Jews, represented in 12 schools, libraries, and cultural institutions.
- Training in the monitoring of hate speech on the internet for two groups of Tarnow's youth.
- Tour for the volunteers of project MEZUZA trailing Jewish culture in the region.
